Hi Dan

I am advised that you need to consider anything that may impact air quality, marine environment (mobile mammals and pollution) or nearby roost/habitat/flight lines for bats. In addition to those cases already mentioned, you may want to consider the following:

South Hook CHP (unimplemented DCO consent).

5No. 100m wind turbines south of Valero Refinery (currently awaiting planning appeal decision).

Greenlink – electricity interconnector between Ireland and UK with landfall at Freshwater West & infrastructure at Pembroke Power Station (currently subject to environmental surveys & application for marine licence).

Pembrokeshire Demonstration Zone (testing of offshore renewable energy devices – 90sq km seabed - offshore from south Pembrokeshire) (currently subject to EIA Scoping).

In relation to bats, possibly Blackpool Mill (leisure development within National Park - refused PP but likely to be re-submitted). There is potential leisure/hotel development at Slebech, also within the National Park, that may be subject to an EIA Screening in the near future but appreciate that no further details are available presently.
